## PLANT CARE

### WATERING

Your new plantings will need an inch of water per week for the first year. In the heat of summer, you may have to water daily due to additional heat and evaporation. Soaker hoses and a timer system may be used to save time and money, however, you must ensure that sufficient water penetrates the rootball of each plant. Water should pool up at the base of the plant when the soil has been adequately saturated. Water not only under the drip line of the plant, but also several feet out from this. Otherwise, dry soil will wick away moisture from roots. If planting occurs in the Spring, water 3 times minimum per week, for the first 3 weeks, whether it rains or not. After the first 3 weeks, water twice per week whether it rains or not. If the planting occurs in the Fall, and the plant still has leaves, you will need to continue to follow the above water guidelines. If the plant has lost its leaves, soak thoroughly one time after planting. Begin watering again in the spring when the new foliage appears, following the aforementioned watering guidelines. Monitor the plants after the first 3 weeks and apply additional water as necessary. It is best to water early in the morning to prevent evaporation or rot if watered too late in the day.

### PLANT MAINTENANCE

Foxscapes will insure that all shrubs, trees, and perennials are to date on deadheading, trimming, and shaping and that there are no dead branches or sections of the plant. After installation, it is the homeowner's responsibility to maintain the plant material or hire Foxscapes to take care of the plants. Foxscapes will do a final walk-around of the property and plant material to show when and how to take care of the plant material.

## WARRANTY

Foxscapes will replace once, any plant material provided and planted by us if the plant material dies in the first twelve months after planting. This warranty excludes fatalities resulting from exposure to drought conditions, tornadoes, high winds, abnormal winters, under-watering or over-watering, overly wet ground conditions, adverse soil conditions, animal damage, lightning strikes, over-fertilizing, over-pruning, or other injurious acts.
